Topic: Preventing recruitment for the ISIS and other active terrorist organizations in Syria and Iraq

*Security Council,*

**Reaffirming** the maintenance of international peace and security as the primary responsibility of the UN Security Council as the UN Charter states,

**Recalling** 14 major instruments of the international law with their amendments appertaining to various aspects of prevention of terrorism, in particular, 1997 International Convention for the Suppression of Terrorist Bombings, prohibiting use of explosive devices in public sites, 1999 International Convention for the Suppression of the Financing of Terrorism which demand cutting finance channels of terrorist organizations,

**Deeply concerned** about the current compounding political, humanitarian crisis in Syria which has become battleground of different extremist organizations, chiefly, ISIS, the Al-Nusrah Front (ANF) and other cells, affiliates, splinter groups or derivatives of Al-Qaida, and the threat to international peace and security these organizations pose,

**Expressing** strong concern about recruitment of foreign combatants for these terrorist organizations,

***Reaffirming*** that terrorism in all forms and demonstrations constitutes one of the most serious threats to international peace and security and that any acts of terrorism are criminal and unjustifiable regardless of their motivations,

***Recognizing*** that international cooperation and any measures taken by Member States to prevent and combat terrorism must comply fully with the Charter of the United Nations,

***Expressing concern*** about international networks established by terrorist organizations among States of origin, transit and destination to channel foreign recruits and the resources to support their operations,

1. *Condemns* the violent extremism, which can be conducive to terrorism, sectarian violence, and the commission of terrorist acts by foreign terrorist fighters, and *demand*s that all foreign terrorist fighters disarm and cease all terrorist acts and participation in armed conflict;
2. *Deplores* all terrorist acts by ISIS and other terrorist organizations in Syria and Iraq and condemns their extremist ideology;
3. *Notes with concern* the recruitment of thousands of combatants to these terrorist organizations from various countries of the world and *demand*s all these fighters to leave these organizations immediately;
4. *Reaffirms* the obligation of all States to prevent the movement of terrorists or terrorist groups through employment of effective mechanism for border controls and controls on issuance of identity papers and travel documents, and to prevent counterfeiting;
5. *Encourages* the use of the evidence-based screening procedures and traveler risk assessment along with the collection and analysis of travel data, avoiding profiling based on stereotypes brought for by the grounds of discrimination prohibited by international law;
6. *Urges* Member States to utilize all bilateral or multilateral mechanisms, in particular through the United Nations to reinforce the exchange of operational information concerning actions or movements of terrorists or terrorist networks, foreign terrorist fighters, especially with their States of residence or nationality;
7. *Strongly encourages* Member states to vigilantly monitor propaganda by the terrorist structures on social media and other platforms on internet aimed at recruiting new combatants and raising donations, through employing effective mechanisms of social media and broadly internet media content filtering by on all grounds avoiding restriction of the freedom of expression on internet media;

8. *Urges* Member states to intensify the control to prevent dissemination of audio, video materials and publication of material promulgating extremist ideologies with an aim at recruiting new combatants;
9. *Encourages* Member states to employ all measures to counter the media propaganda by the extremist organizations through counter-propaganda media materials and support of the grassroots initiatives of the non-profit organizations to fight against the radicalization in communities;
10. *Calls upon* Member States to improve international, regional, and sub-regional cooperation, if appropriate through bilateral agreements, to prevent the travel of foreign terrorist fighters from or through their territories, including through;
11. *Decides* to remain actively seized of the matter.
